

### Treasurer's Report

Hello ladies,

So much is happening right now and I would just like to give you a rundown on where things stand as treasurer for the Raffle and the Guild.



Raffle Account as of Oct 30, 2011 - We have a balance of \$3127.61 Deposits since September 6 have been \$2157.01, and if you add to that \$688.00 in tickets sold at the Quilt Show (which will be transferred) we have made \$2845.02. This is already \$400.00 more than we made last raffle! Sincere thanks go to Margaret and Jane who headed the sales of tickets etc. and to Marion and team who headed up the construction of the 2 lovely quilts. Very special thanks for ALL OF THE VOLUNTEERS who helped in both of these areas.

General Account as of Oct 30, 2011 - There is \$6622.00 in that account. The only large cheque written on the account was for Programme, for Judy Gascho-Jutzi for \$415.00. There was \$38.00 collected for Library raffle and 50/50 raised \$27.50.

The Quilt show was a wonderful success! The profit report for that account will be made at this next meeting, but it does look VERY healthy! Thank you for all involved. We done good!



### **Building Warmth: A Log Cabin Exhibit - Aboyne, Ontario**

### **DATE**

Saturday September 10, 2011 - Sunday March 25, 2012

Building Warmth: A Log Cabin Quilt opens at Wellington County Museum and Archives on September 10, 2011.

"Quilts created in log cabin patterns were based on the design of the first settler homes." said Susan Dunlop, Curator. "The log walls provided the shelter from the elements and the kitchen hearth gave light and warmth."

Inspired by this image of warmth and protection, women created the log cabin quilt pattern from thousands of scraps. Colourful strips were sewn together as the walls of the cabin. A red square was placed in the centre, representing the heart of the home. These exquisite quilts are balanced designs rich in colour, texture and history.

This exhibit runs until March 25, 2012.

The Wellington County Museum and Archives is located on Wellington Road #18 between Fergus and Elora. The galleries are open weekdays from 9:30 am to 4:30 pm and 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm on weekends and holidays.

### 2011/2012 "Play on Words" President's Challenge

At the start of each Guild season a president's challenge is issued to all interested members. The guild President announces a challenge project. Each member has until the end of the year to complete the project and bring it to the designated Halton Hills Quilters' Guild meeting. The full guild membership votes on the finished project and prizes are awarded. The project may be based on a specific theme, quilting technique, color, etc. It is a fun way to challenge your creativity and practice some quilting techniques you may not usually use.

When a non-quilter hears the phrase Swine Flu, I'll bet she cringes and thinks of a week in bed with aches and pains. Let a quilter hear the term, though, and she might imagine a fun-loving group of colorful pigs flying over a patchwork landscape. Consider these quilt patterns or sayings: Flying Geese, Snail's Trail, Broken Star, Cold Cash, Shoot for the Moon. How would a quilter translate those into fabric? I know you've got some great words and phrases of your own and look forward to seeing how you interpret them in fabric. So, the 2011/2012 challenge is a "Play on Words". The rules are flexible. Your challenge project may be a quilt, wall hanging, free standing, or wearable in any size, shape, or color, either contemporary or traditional. Lettering and embellishments are encouraged. Projects will be turned in at the May 28th meeting. Those in attendance at that meeting will vote on their favorites and try to guess what play on words is being depicted. At the June meeting, we'll present prizes and ask makers to tell more about their quilts.
